He was right and there was no toy on the floor, but she didn't make her bed. My son in law told me that it is still difficult for her to make her bed on her own and since her mommy was busy she couldn't help her in it. So I tried to tell her how to make her bed. I took my laptop to my bedroom as well and showed her how I make my bed. As I found out my granddaughter liked to spend some time with her daddy, we said goodbye.
